a) Preparatory activities for the Conference on Civic Reason

1. Preparatory meeting with Prof. Abdullahi Ahmed An-Na'im

Date and venue: 30-31 January 2009, Catholic University Leuven, (Belgium)

On January 31rst Kosmopolis staff met Prof. Abdullahi Ahmed An-Na`im in Leuven (Belgium) to discuss the content and scope of the May conference. In Leuven, they also attended the conference and public lecture Islam and the Secular State, in honor of Abdullahi Ahmed An-Na`im.

2. Study group on Civic Reason

February – May 2009

In preparation of the conference, the Kosmopolis Institute initiated a multi-disciplinary study group on civic reason, human rights and secularism. UvH and Hivos staff, as well as staff from the Institute for Social Studies (ISS) in The Hague. The group met on a regular basis to discuss relevant texts.

b) International Conference: 'Promoting Pluralism through Civic Reason? Rethinking the Secular'

Date and venue: 25-26 May 2009, Polmanshuis/University for Humanistics, Utrecht (The Netherlands)

In cooperation with Hivos, the Kosmopolis Institute organized a conference on the future of secularism, the secular state and the potential for social action in the context of religious revitalization. A diverse group of 45 activists, academics, legal experts and policy makers from various parts of the world participated in the conference.

Internationally renowned participants included Prof. dr. An-Na`im and Justice Aftab Alam, sitting judge of the Supreme Court of India, gave key note addresses. Other participants included University of Amsterdam professors Prof dr. Veit Bader and Prof dr. Jan Breman. NGO staff from participating organisations in India, Indonesia and Uganda and from Kosmopolis presented their experiences with pluralism-secularism in practice.

c) Public Debate: 'Why Muslims need a Secular State and Western Politics should not Interfere', Abdullahi Ahmed An-Na`im in conversation with Maurits Berger Date and venue: may 25 2009, Ottone, Utrecht, the Netherlands

On May 25th 2009, Prof. An-Na`im participated in a public debate, organized by Kosmopolis/Hivos. Prof. dr. Maurits Berger (University of Leiden) acted as moderator. An-Na`im and Berger discussed the central elements of the theories of An-Na`im and discussed their views on the Dutch public debate on freedom of expression and freedom of religion. Approximately one hundred people attended this lively debate. Human.nl reported about this event here.

d) Film- and discussion evening for UvH students and students UU (gender studies) November 26 2009

Kosmopolis organised an evening for UvH students and international University of Utrecht students (Gender studies) themed 'Homophobia in Africa –according to Western standards?' Two African documentaries were shown: (1) Victor & Georgina (filmed over a period of 2 years by Ugandan cineast Alice Smits) and 7 years (made by Dutch film maker Bram Vergeer).

Paul Jansen (Hivos, The Hague), who was involved in the making of both documentaries, was invited to tell more about his work in Africa. Over 30 students were present at this evening.
