Korte beschrijving van de inhoud	Intersectionality has become a 'buzzword' in critical feminist and anti-racist theory as the best way to understand the interaction between gender, race, and other categories of difference in individual lives, social practices, institutional arrangements, and cultural ideologies and the outcomes of these interactions in terms of power. But how can we actually use intersectionality in our research? In this lecture, I will talk about some of the 'in's' and 'out's' of intersectionality as a methodology. Several strategies will be explored for using intersectionality as a helpmeet for doing critical research.

She was co-editor of the <i>European Journal of Women's Studies</i> for many years. Her research interests include: sociology of the body, intersectionality, travelling theory and transnational practices; biography as methodology and critical and creative strategies for academic writing. She is the author of many books, including <i>Reshaping the Female Body</i> (Routledge, 1995), <i>Dubious Equalities and Embodied Differences</i> (Rowman & Littlefield, 2003), and <i>The Making of Our Bodies, Ourselves: How Feminism Travels Across Borders</i> (Duke, 2007) and <i>Dancing Tango: Passionate Encounters in a Globalizing World</i> (NYUPress, 2015). She is currently working on the <i>Routledge Handbook of Intersectionality Studies</i> with Helma Lutz.
